The Pearson textbook on international economics, a part of which is used for Economics 103, comes in three versions. The complete textbook on international economics is Krugman, Obstfeld, and Melitz (2015a) and contains 22 chapters, covering both international trade (chapters 2–12) and international macroeconomics (chapters 13–22) after a common introduction (chapter 1).

The part for Econ 103 has been published as a separate textbook extract: Krugman, Obstfeld, and Melitz (2015b). This textbook extract contains the common introduction (chapter 1) and the chapters on international macroeconomics (chapters 13–22), renumbered to 2–11 (subtract 11 from the original chapter number).
